Nolan O'Rourke is a kindergarten student at Fallsington Elementary School and was nominated by Cherie Lynne Kooker, Kristen Cahill, Vinny DePaola, Terri Sherman, Kellianne Minniti, Kristina Rehill, Carey Stolber, and Sherri Cohoon. They say that Nolan always offers his time to help others, plays fair, and never wants to see anyone sit on the buddy bench alone. Nolan always follows directions and is willing to work with his classmates. He has a wonderful personality that makes everyone feel welcome. If a classmate wants a book he wants, he is always willing to let the classmate check out the book and wait for his turn the following week. Nolan cooperates with teachers and students in his classroom. He follows directions, raises his hand, and participates in the lessons. Anna Kilch-it-ska is a third-grade student at Eleanor Roosevelt Elementary School and was nominated by Kris Bria. She says that Anna started the school year with a wonderful attitude and an eagerness to participate, cooperate, and learn as much as possible. Anna is a person who can collaborate with anyone.
